IOWA COMMUNITY FOUNDATIONS

Community foundations harness giving for local needs. They bring together the financial resources of individuals, families, and businesses to support effective nonprofits and charitable causes – right in their own communities. Community foundations serve a specific geographic region; in lowa we have more than 130 covering all 99 counties. We have built one of the strongest networks in the nation, thanks to generous lowans and two highly successful state-legislated programs. Iowa Community Foundations have identified a few ways we need support from the Legislature to sustain and maximize these programs.

ENDOW IOWA TAX CREDITS:



OFFER A 25% STATE INCOME TAX CREDIT

to donors who make gifts to an endowed fund at a qualified community foundation* in lowa;



ARE AWARDED ON A

first-come, first-served basis;



OFFER A MAXIMUM ANNUAL CREDIT OF

\$100,000 per taxpayer & \$200,000 per couple (beginning 1/1/23);



CAN BE CLAIMED BY

individuals, businesses, or financial institutions;



AND ARE NOT

transferable or refundable.

Demand has outpaced available credits for several years, resulting in a long waitlist.

However, the waitlist process will be discontinued on July 1, 2023.

The Iowa Economic Development Authority has communicated that they do not have the authority to oversee and administer tax credit waitlists. They plan to discontinue the waitlist process which will cause the program to shut down. The Legislature has the authority to address this challenge and keep the program working for Iowans.

COUNTY ENDOWMENT FUND PROGRAM:

Through the County Endowment Fund Program (CEFP), 0.8% of the state's commercial gaming tax revenue is distributed to community foundations in the 84 counties that do not hold a state-issued gaming license. The community foundations then annually grant **75%** of those funds to nonprofits and charitable projects within their counties and place the remaining **25%** of funds in a permanent endowment fund, which is intended to attract other donations and provide a source of permanent funding for charitable projects within the county – *forever*.

ABOUT QUALIFIED SPONSORING ORGANIZATION GRANTMAKING:

There are 15 counties with state-licensed gaming facilities that do not participate in the program. However, each of those gaming facilities funds a nonprofit entity, a Qualified Sponsoring Organization (QSO), that distributes charitable grants on their behalf in their area. Through both efforts, charitable investments are made annually in each county throughout lowa.

OUR Goals

ENDOW IOWA:

- Make tax credits readily available for all lowans.
- Avoid closing the program down when waitlist process ends.
- Right-size the program by making \$7M in credits available annually.
- Make Endow lowa tax credits available to more lowans.

COUNTY ENDOWMENT FUND PROGRAM + QSO GRANTMAKING:

- Increase the amount of annual grantmaking available in each of lowa's 99 counties.
- Distribute funds through community foundations and QSOs that have well established processes.
- Utilize local leaders as decision makers to meet community needs.

Assumptions (based on the HF 2566 fiscal note): Annual tax receipts from sports wagering and internet fantasy sports contests will likely exceed \$6.1 M annually. \$1.75 M will continue to be appropriated to the DHHS for the purposes of gambling treatment as outlined in lowa Code Section 135.150.

Last year HF 2566 was passed out of the House 87-6. This bill allocated the dollars in the sports gambling fund to be appropriated through the County Endowment Fund Program. We hope to strengthen this bill with an expanded approach this session.

OUR ASK FOR 2023 PART



Appropriate a one-time amount of \$7M to the Endow Iowa tax credit program as outlined in Iowa Code Section 15E.305 to eliminate the waitlist within IEDA.



Continue to appropriate \$1.75M to the Gambling Treatment Program outlined in Iowa Code Section 135.150.



Appropriate \$1M to Endow lowa (15E.305), increasing the credit from \$6M to \$7M annually.



The remaining amount of sports gambling taxes paid shall be divided between the 99 counties evenly through:

- the County Endowment Fund Program created in section 15E.311 (84 non-gaming counties); and
- the QSOs (15 gaming counties) for annual grantmaking purposes.
